Sudan 2nd VNR

- Sudan presented the 2nd VNR in 2022 during the HLPF in July 2022.
- Government led process with wide participation from the private sector, civil society organizations, the states (18 state), youth and women association.
- Some progress was made in some of the goals, 4 quality education, 5 gender equality, 6 save drinking water, 14 life below water, 15 life on land and 17 partnerships.

Challenges

- Political instability.
- Frequent tribal and armed conflicts.
- Olimate change: affected the patterns of production and consumption, food security, displacements.
- **■** Covid 19
- Weak capacity: Human and Institutions-
- Poor infrastructure.

Challenges (cont.)

- Incomplete data and information sets.
- Absence of robust M & E system.
- Limited engagement with APRM- Yet to be developed and expanded.
- Leaving no one behind: Inclusion of refugees and IDPs and other vulnerable groups- an estimate of 4.5 million of population (2 million refugees, 2.5 million IDPs).

The way forward

- Need to align the national SDGs frame with the national 2063 agenda to form one comprehensive national development path-Critical need of technical assistance.
- An integrated financial frame is currently under preparation to support resource mobilization – The process need to be supported and strengthened.

The way forwards (cont.)

- There is a need of full M& E system to enforce transparency & accountability- Technical assistance is required.
- There is a need of a sub-M & E system to monitor the budget resource allocations and disbursement to the various sectors of the economy. This could be done by applying the functional classification of the budget along the principles of the GFS 14

The way forward (cont.)

More active engagement of the APRM
 with Sudan to create a sensible
 development frame that encompass both
 2030 agenda and 2063 agenda.
