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High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF)

The HLPF has a “central role in overseeing a network of follow-up and review processes at the global level”

(2030 Agenda paragraph 82)

The HLPF also aims to:

- ✓ enhance the integration of the Three dimensions of sustainable development
- ✓ provide political leadership, guidance and recommendations on implementation and follow-up
- ✓ address new and emerging issues





2023 HLPF: 10 to 19 July 2023

Ministerial Segment: 17 to 19 July 2023

Theme: "Accelerating the recovery from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development at all levels"

SDGs under review: **SDG 6** on clean water and sanitation, **SDG 7** on affordable and clean energy, **SDG 9** on industry, innovation and infrastructure, **SDG 11** on sustainable cities and communities, and **SDG 17** on partnerships for the Goals

However, VNR reports should cover all of the SDGs

The SDG Summit

The HLPF meets each year under the auspices of the UN Economic and Social Council for 8 days and **every four years under the auspices of the General Assembly for two days.**

The next meeting under the General Assembly will be held in **September 2023**, and is referred to as the **SDG Summit**, where heads of state will come together to reconfirm their commitment to the 2030 Agenda and announce new initiatives to accelerate its implementation.



Principles of Voluntary National Reviews

Voluntary	encourage reporting and include developed and developing countries
Country-led	country-driven reviews of progress at national and sub-national levels
Rigorous and based on evidence	informed by country-led evaluations and data which is high-quality, accessible, reliable and disaggregated
Learning experience	facilitate the sharing of experiences, including successes, challenges and lessons learned, part of a process
National circumstances	reviews in accordance with national circumstances, policies and priorities, together with relevant partners
Open, Inclusive, Participatory	Including supporting reporting on progress by all relevant stakeholders

How to maximize benefits from the first VNR?

- ✓ Embed VNRs into institutions and link the VNRs to report to other mechanisms and conventions
- ✓ Undertake costing analysis for SDGs and align with national budgets
- ✓ Strengthen policy coherence by identifying interlinkages among SDGs and assessing trade-offs
- ✓ Engage parliaments and supreme audit institutions
- ✓ Report at the national level before and after a VNR has been presented at the HLPF
- ✓ Take actions in the executive and legislative branches of government

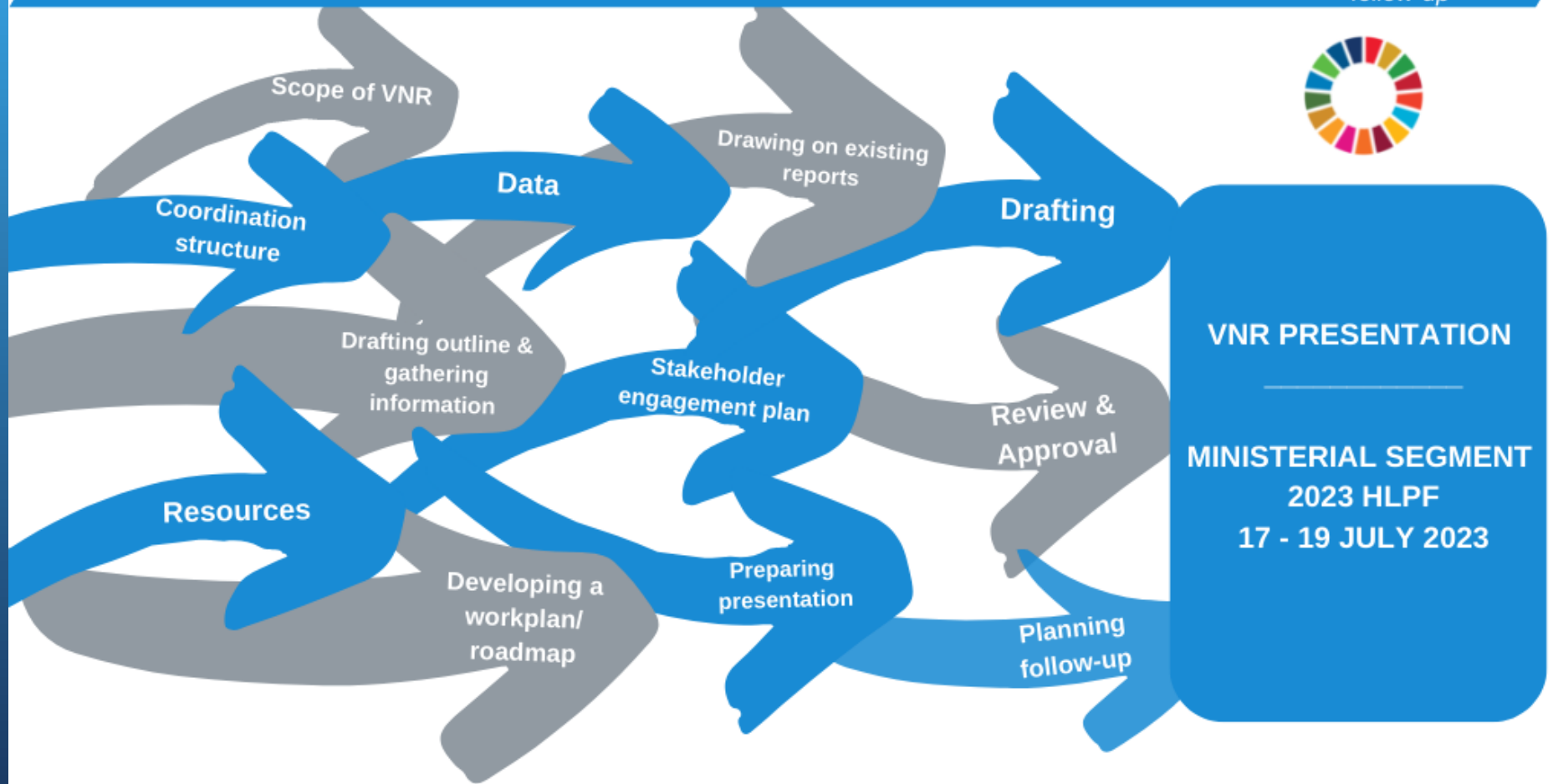

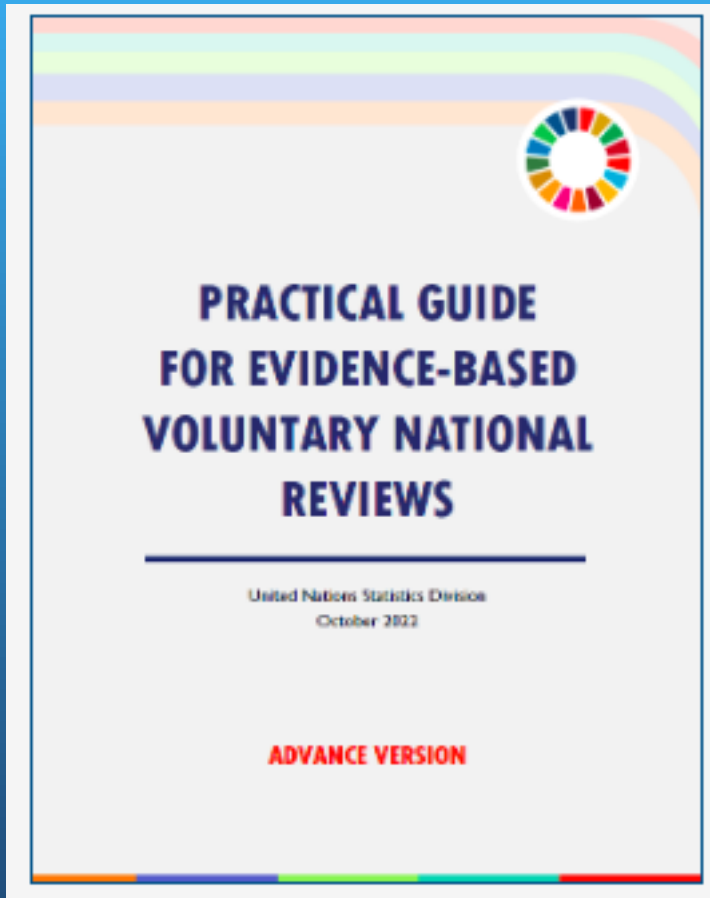
Highlight the main message s and lessons from the VNR
