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












The 2022 VNR Process

Overview

Liberia officially launched the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in 2016 and conducted its first VNR in 2020

In 2018, Liberia aligned its Pro-poor Agenda for Prosperity and Development (PAPD) with the SDGs

This is Liberia's second VNR. Unlike the first VNR, this review benefited from evidence-based reporting, early planning, and better stakeholders' engagement

The 2022 VNR focused on 11 priority SDGs.

The review was further informed by a readiness assessment and the development of a VNR implementation framework.





BEST PRACTICES AND LESSONS LEARNED

- ✓ National Development Plan should be aligned to SDG Goals & Targets (Domestication of the Goals)
- ✓ Strong Top Leader(s) Ownership & Commitment to Plan Implementation (Garnering Support to Implementation-key advantage)



- ✓ Stakeholders Collaborating and working within the framework of National Development Plan (Country Ownership and Alignment.
- ✓ Clear Reporting Structures cascaded National & Sub-national levels.
- **✓ Encourage Timely reporting** at periodic specified meetings of teams (Pillar Leads).
- ✓ Cross-check & Validate Reports at intervals





For Voluntary National Reporting:

- **✓** Start Early preparations
- **✓** Conduct your readiness assessment far in advance
- ✓ Knowledgeable Stakeholders involved with implementation should feed draft report.
- ✓ Encourage review and inputs to final draft VNR.
- ✓ Use more Images to narrate the story (time limits at High Level Political Forum)
- ✓ Choose your best Policy Level Staff to present your VNR
