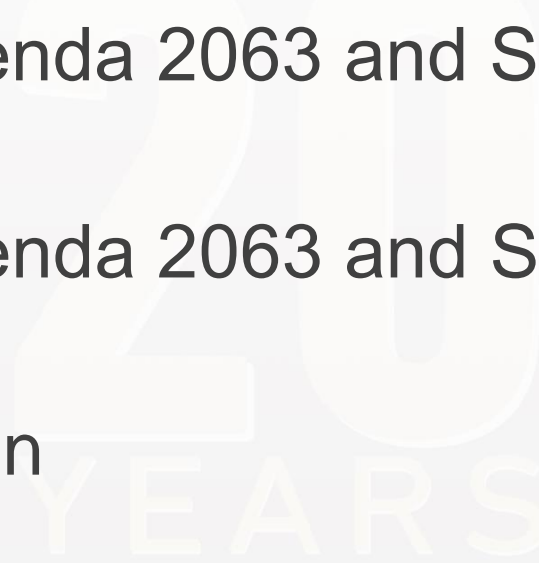

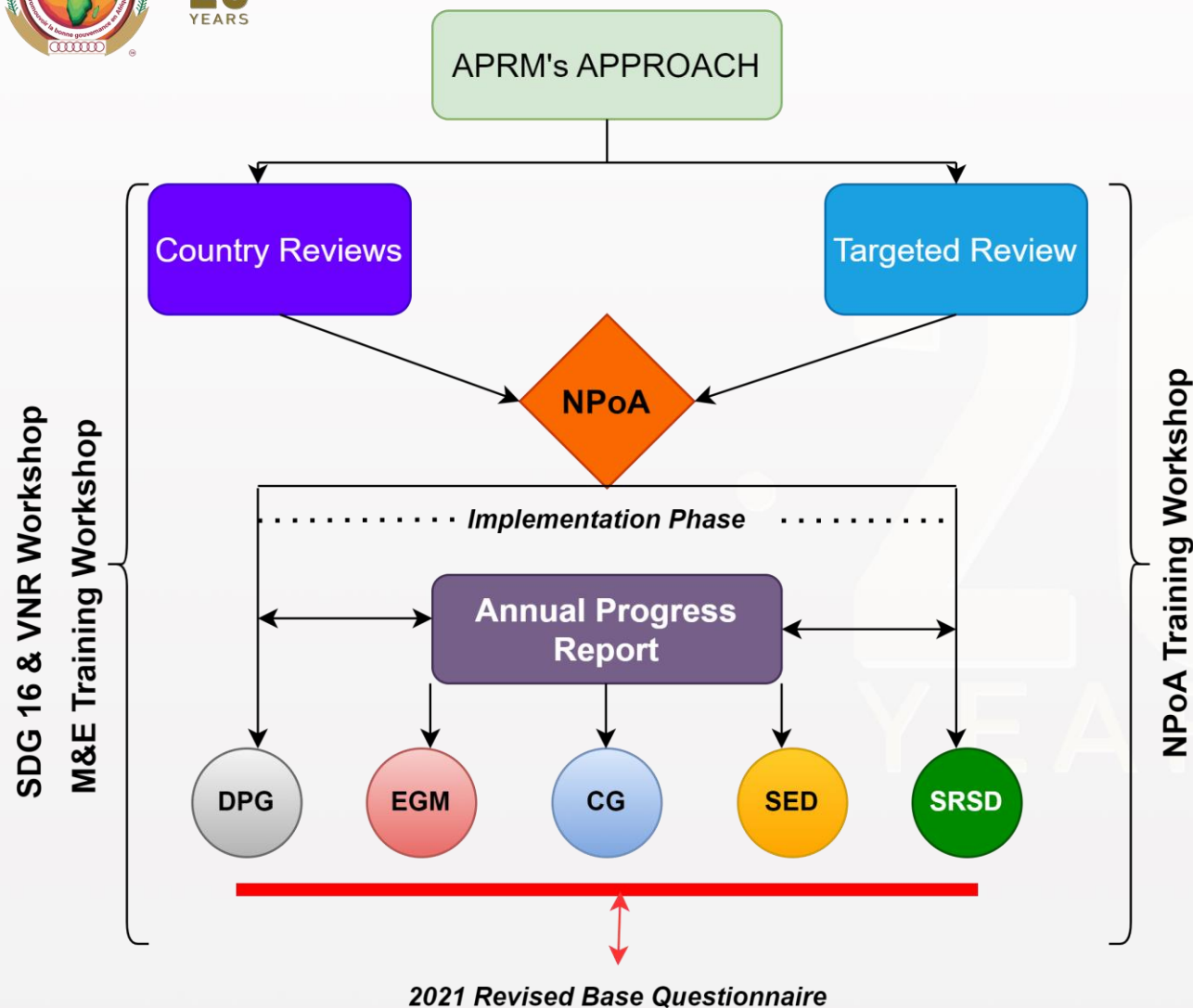

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ASSESSMENT OF SDG's & AGENDA 2063: APRM's APPROACH



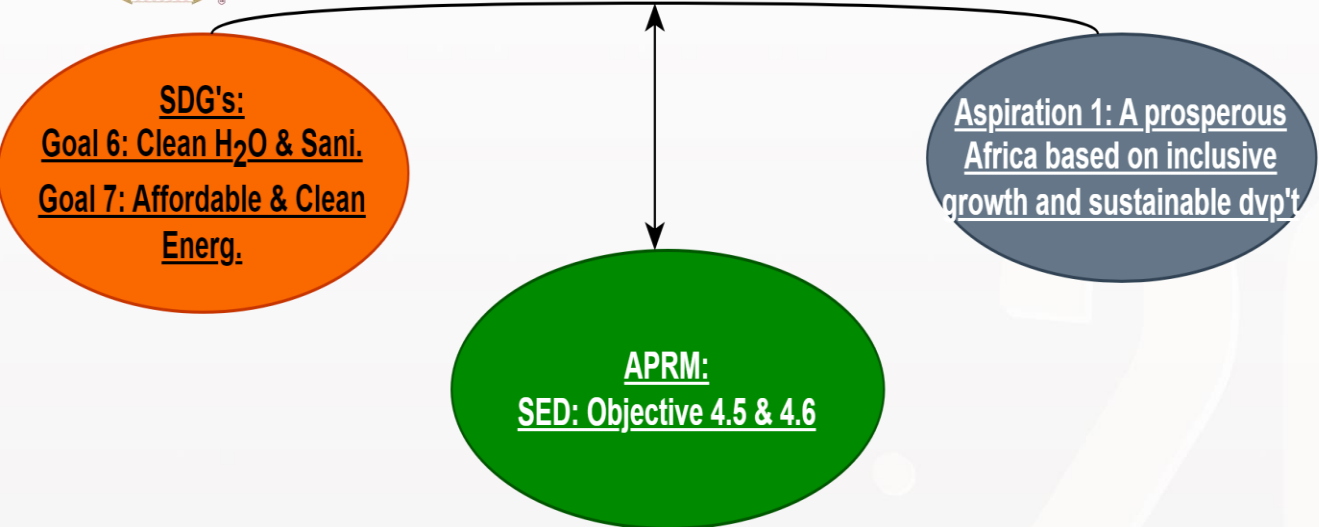
Key Highlights

- ❖ The 17 goals of SDG's are **embedded** in the revised APRM Base Questionnaire across the FIVE Thematic Areas (TA's)
- ❖ Similarly, the seven aspirations of Agenda 2063 are also **embedded** in the revised APRM base questionnaire across the FIVE TA's.
- ❖ The **degree of integration** (on a scale of 0 – 100), however, vary from one goal, or aspiration to another.
- ❖ Thus, APRM's **exploratory** assessment, to a greater extent, covers SDG's and Agenda 2063
- ❖ APRM member states, **directly and indirectly report** on the progress made in Agenda 2063 and SDG's during preparation and submission of the **progress reports** on the implementation of the NPoA.



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APRM's TOOLS FOR MONITORING SDG's & AGENDA 2063: EXPLORATORY POINT OF VIEW



Key Enabling and Process Indicators (how, why, so what...)

- Describe the tariff and subsidizations strategies, including minimum payment for payment of water services.
- Timely reporting of regional water-use and access distribution in the last 5-10 years.
- Government reporting of regional sanitation access distribution in the last 5-10 years.
- Statistics showing availability and national and regional coverage of energy generation.
- Types of energy supply available (including renewable energy) and mix of technologies and business models, both on and off-grid.
- Describe the subsidy and tariff policies in place to ensure access to energy by all citizens.

APRM's OBJECTIVES:

4.5 Ensure access to services including water, energy, land, as well as modern, affordable and liveable habitat for sustainable socio-economic development

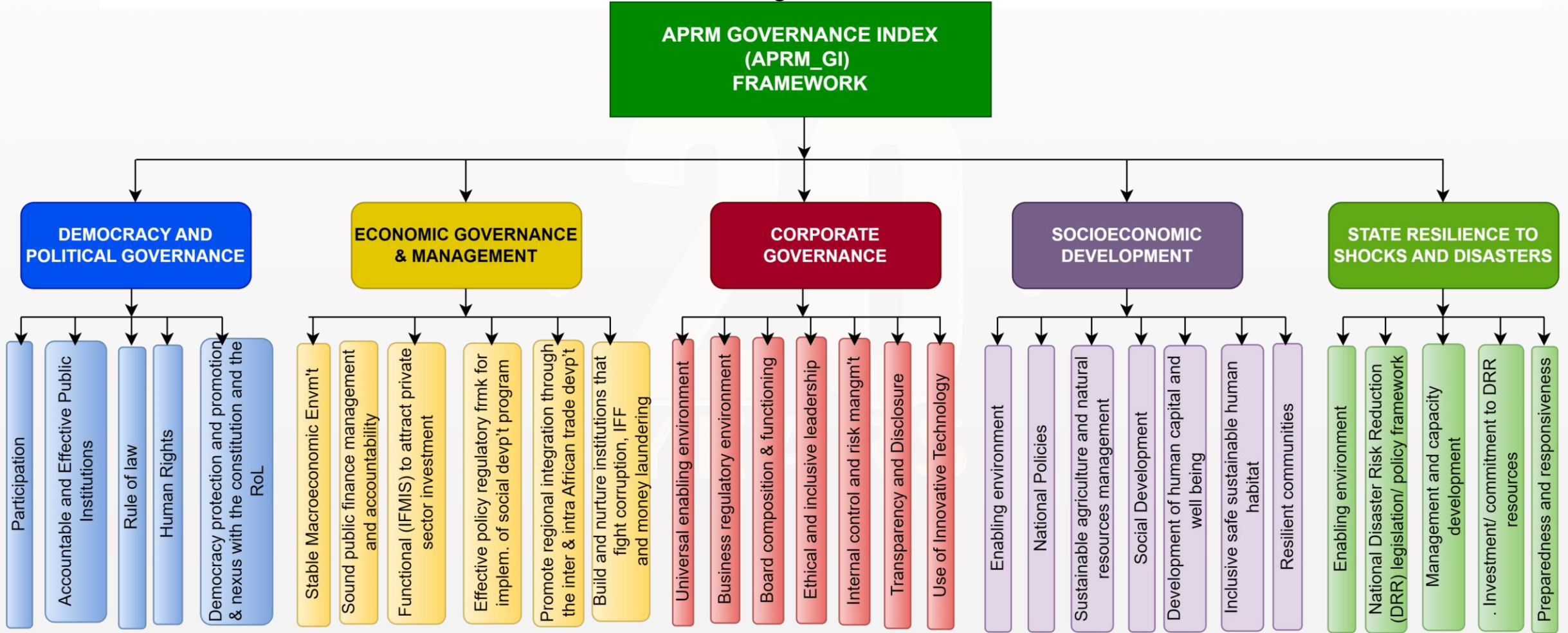

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PROGRESS: THE CASE OF MAURITIUS

Water sector

NPoA and Progress in relation to Goal 6: Excerpt from Mauritius

Issue	Inadequate water supply
Objective	Address the Problem of water shortage
Required Action	(i) Increase water storage capacity, (ii) Reduction of non-revenue water, (iii) Water education campaign,

Progress

“The Government of Mauritius has introduced the Water Tank Grant Scheme to encourage saving of this precious commodity. Since 2016, households which consume up to 6 cubic metre of water are exempted from payment of water charges on a social basis but also to encourage the population to use water efficiently.”

“The water sector is expected to benefit from the following measures: regularising the system of water rights; reuse of wastewater of industries and even households and rechanneling the treated water to the agricultural sector; implementation of Rainwater Harvesting on a wider scale to include all educational institutions and public buildings; encourage large hotels to set up their own wastewater treatment plants; all duties/taxes to be removed on water saving appliances and aggressive promotion campaigns to be launched for such products.”

- APRM assess and monitors SDG's and Agenda 2063 using its base questionnaire, in addition to its upcoming Governance Index across the FIVE TA's.
- Progress and Challenges in the attainment of SDG's and Agenda 2063 are contained in our Country and Targeted Review, annual progress reports, SDG 16 reports, etc..
- In preparation of the VRN member states are encourage to consult APRM National Offices for progress reports and other reports which contain rich body of information on the progress and challenges in the attainment of SDGs and Agenda 2063
