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# 1. With cascading crises of all kinds, the implementation of the 2030 Agenda will be more than ever about collaboration





Some national governments think that localization means **giving instructions and tasks** to local governments (decentralization)



### Hierarchical governance

#### Top-down approach



With a top-down mindset you think that **giving instructions** is the best way of multilevel governance

But having just this one option is not very bright, as Maslov already said, and it is often **slow**

If you only have a hammer, every problem looks like a nail (A. Maslov)





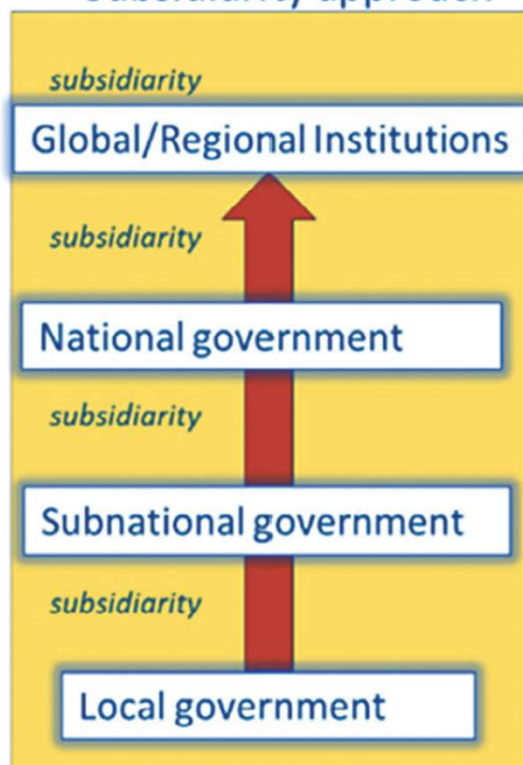


Other national governments think that localization means **getting innovative ideas from empowered local authorities** (subsidiarity)



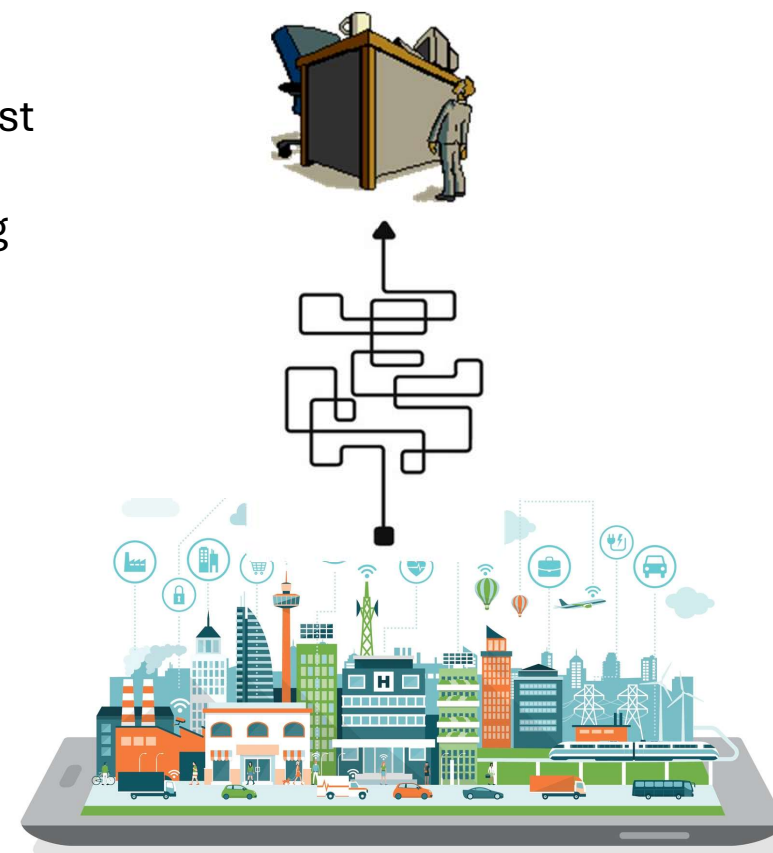
*Market governance*

**Subsidiarity approach**



A bottom-up mindset is just **as one-directional** and **slow** as top-down thinking

**It can take years** before local innovation gets scaled-up and supported nationally, if at all





**Both styles are useful but not enough:** examples show that a **collaborative approach** can also work, and may be faster



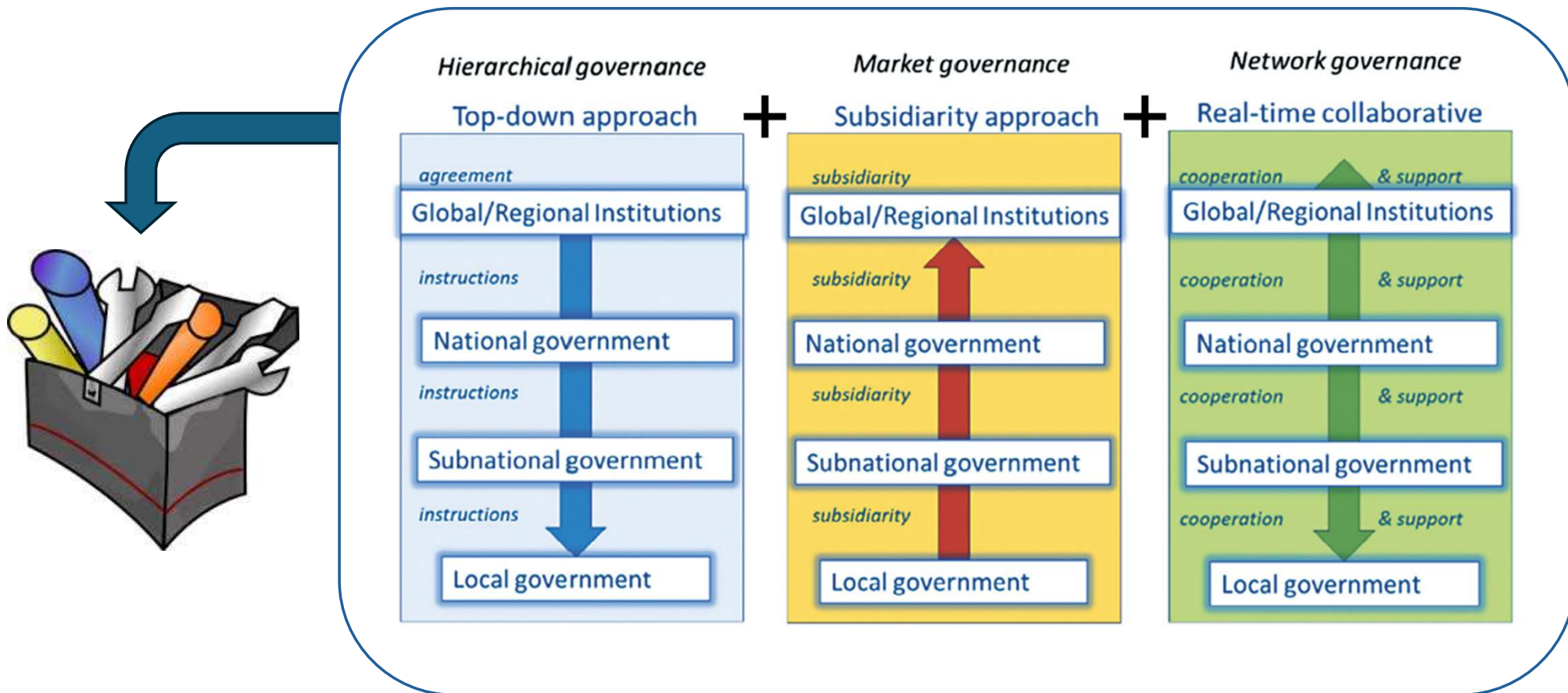

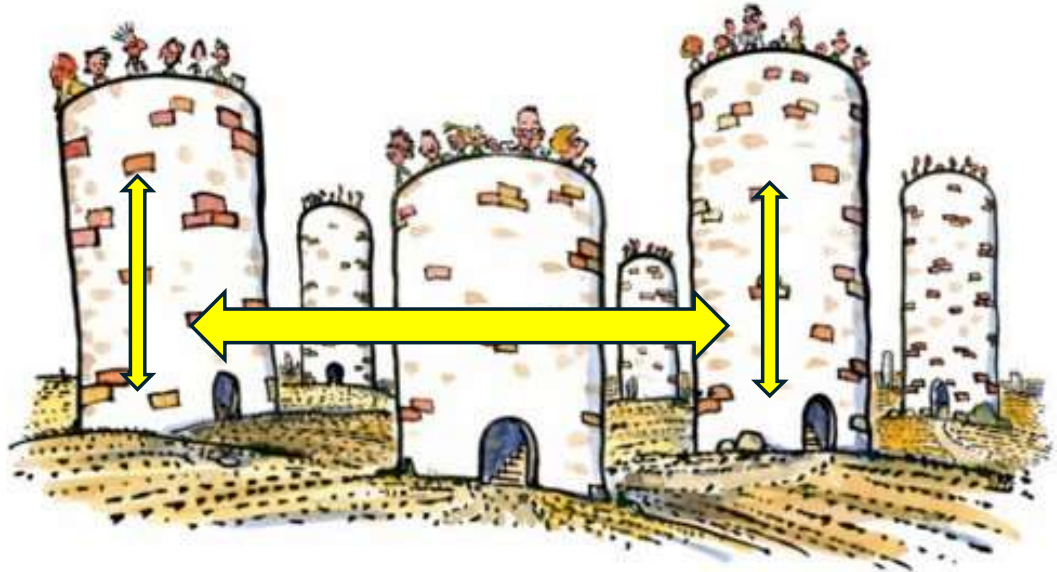
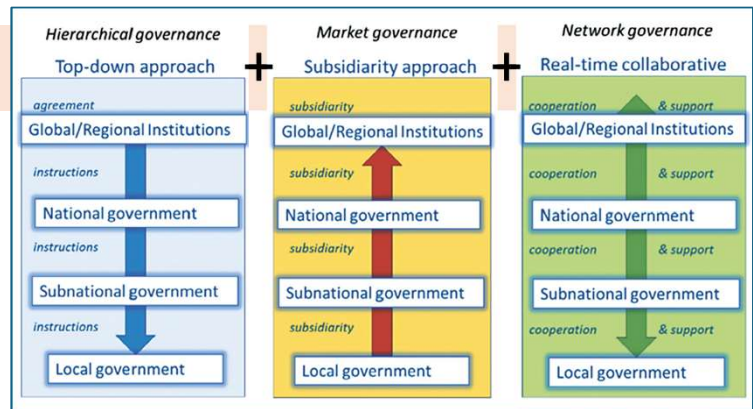






# Why is this not (much) happening?

1. **Silo-thinking** between administrations, within the same level AND between levels



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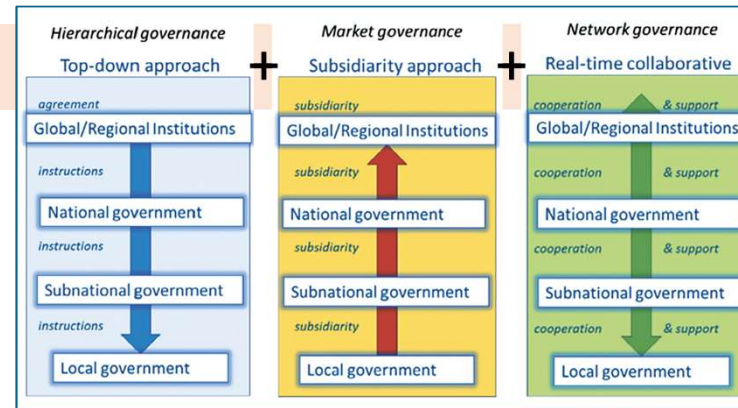
2. **Indifference:** Not understanding the mutual interest of national and local authorities





# Why is this not happening?

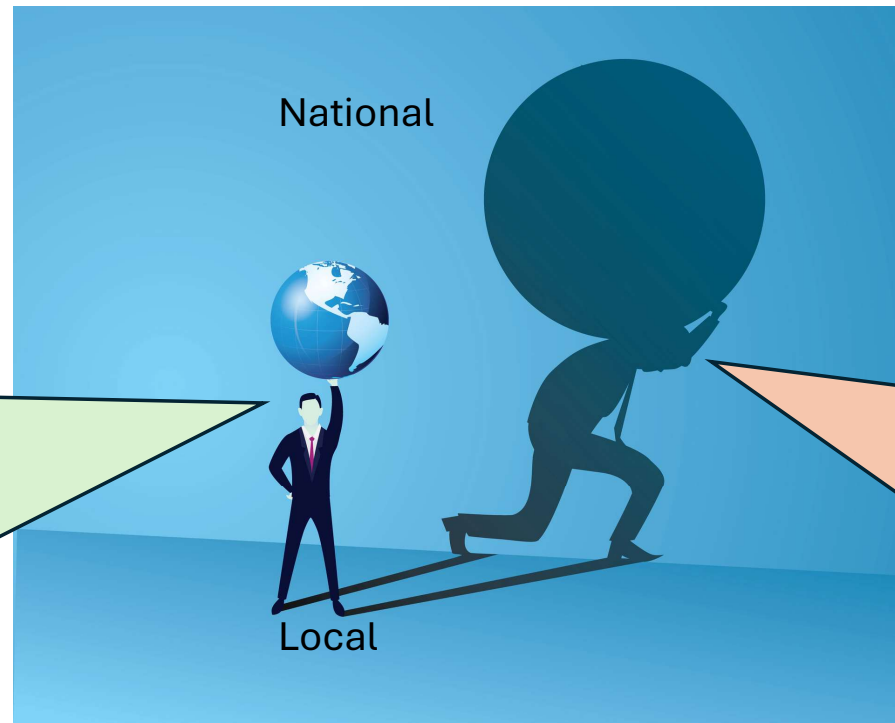
## 3. Two competing mindsets at local level about the national level



### Positive:

“**Cities** are enablers, innovators, and the main public service providers for citizens.

**National government** must support us with resources and the liberty to experiment”



### Negative:

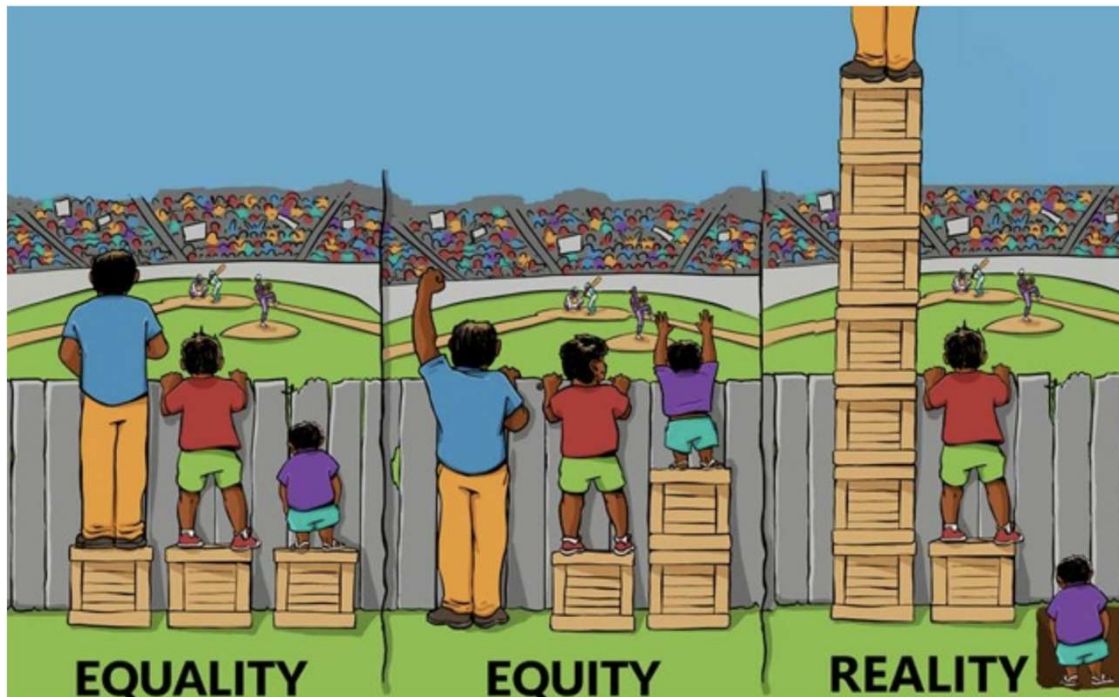
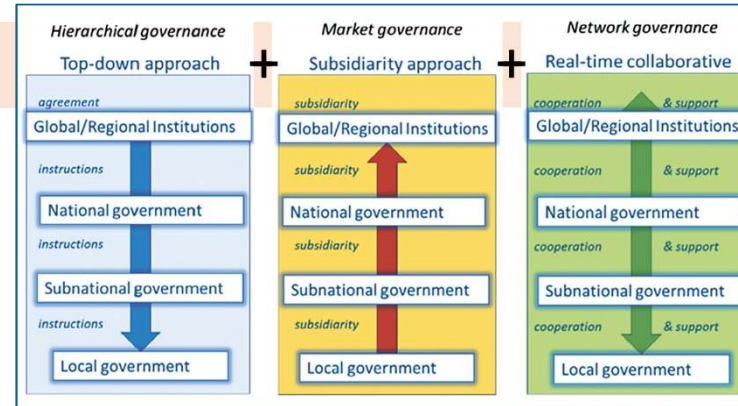
“**Cities** carry the weight, are suppressed and legally restricted to act.

**National government** sees us as too expensive, insubordinate, unreliable“



# Why is this not happening?

4. Not understanding that **collaboration on equal footing** is about **equity, not equality**





## 2. Challenges related to **capacity building, data availability and monitoring mechanisms** at the local level



It is a **misunderstanding** that local indicators and data can just emerge through **disaggregation** of national indicators and data

This can result in **meaningless data....** and wrong decisions based on them





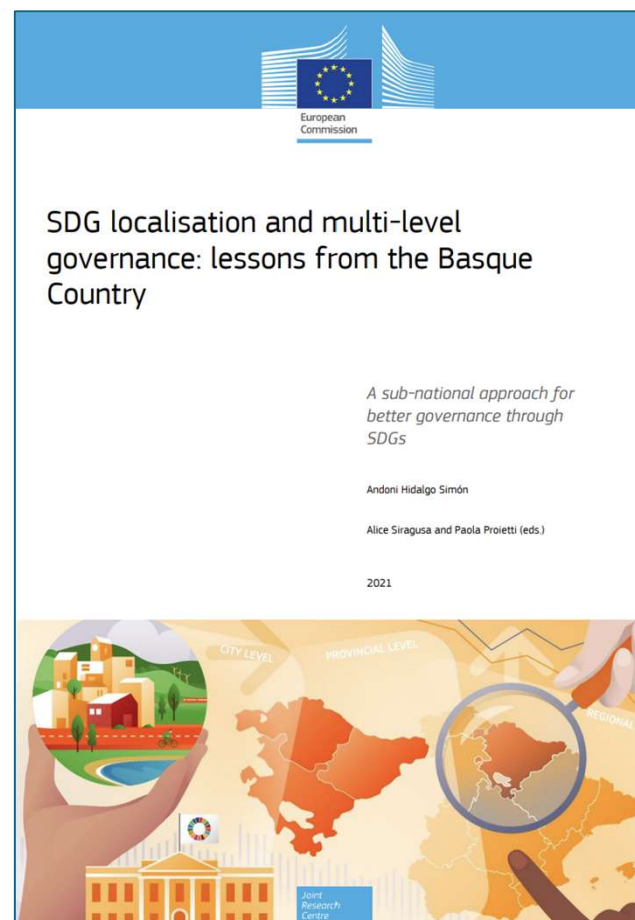


## 2. How to address challenges related to **capacity building, data availability and monitoring mechanisms** at the local level?



**Good example:** project by Joint Research Centre of the European Commission in some European regions/provinces, focusing on indicators and data for Voluntary Local Review processes

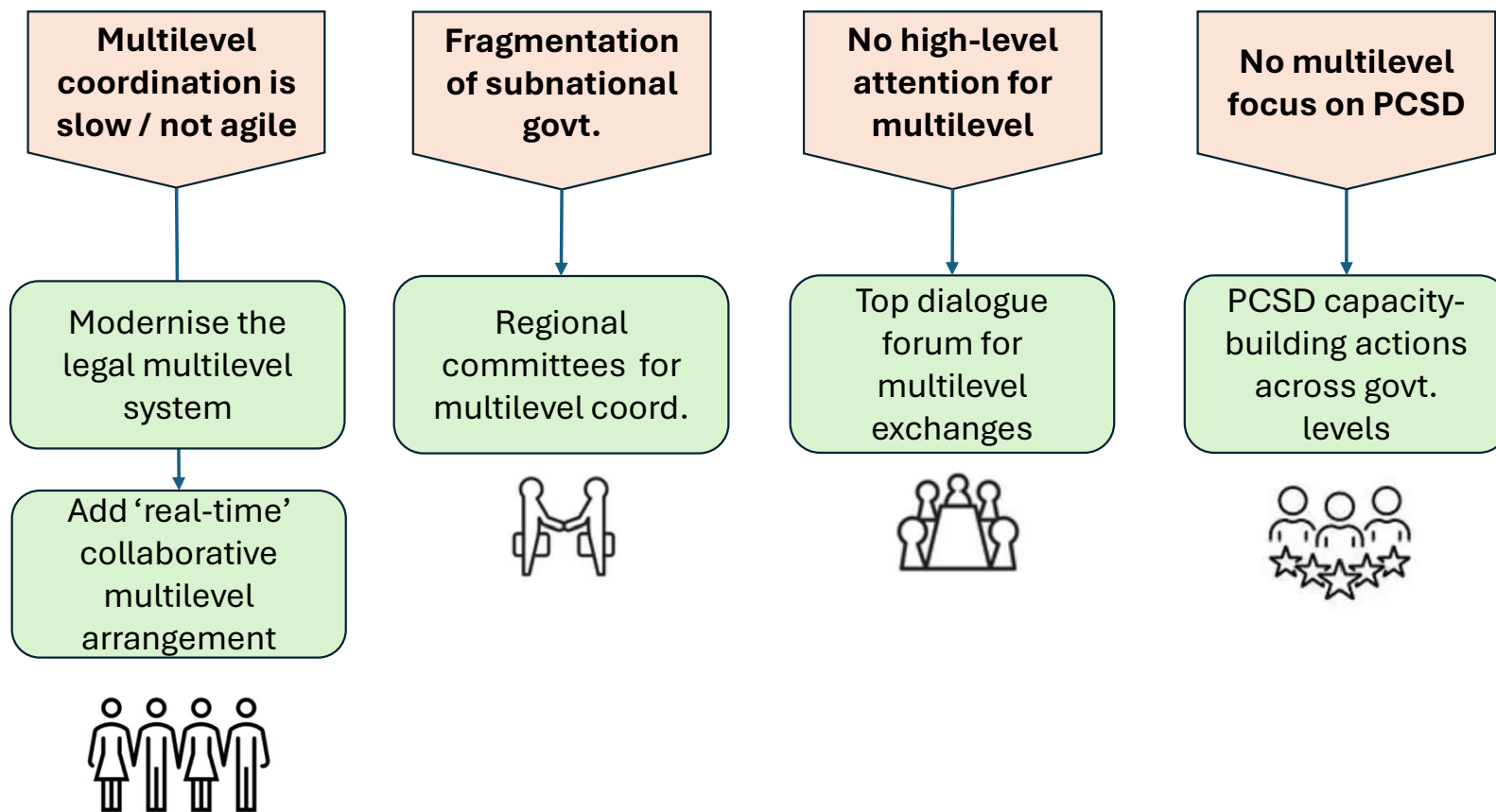

## Handbook on Policy Coherence for Sustainable Development (PCSD) (Indicator 17.14.1) (UNEP, July 2024):

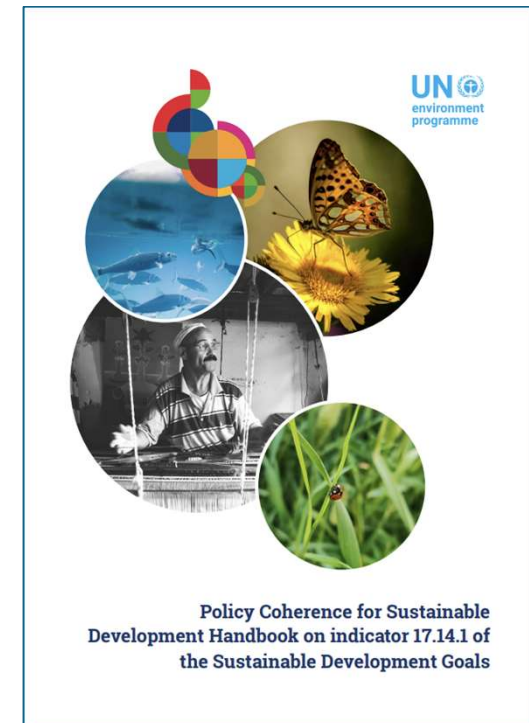
Dimension 6. **Consultation and coordination across government levels:**

**“The country has mechanisms in place for aligning priorities, policies and plans across the various levels of government”.**

Examples:

- **The Government of Burkina Faso** has decided to bring the implementation and monitoring system of the SDGs into the National Economic and Social Development Plan, which envisions cooperation between the national and local levels.
- **The Inter-Ministerial Conference for Sustainable Development in Belgium** is a multilevel panel that comprises federal, regional and community ministers responsible for sustainable development.

**Conclusion 3. Multilevel alignment for localization is supported by *Policy Coherence for SD* at national and local level**

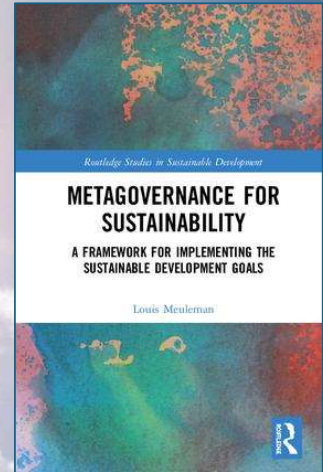
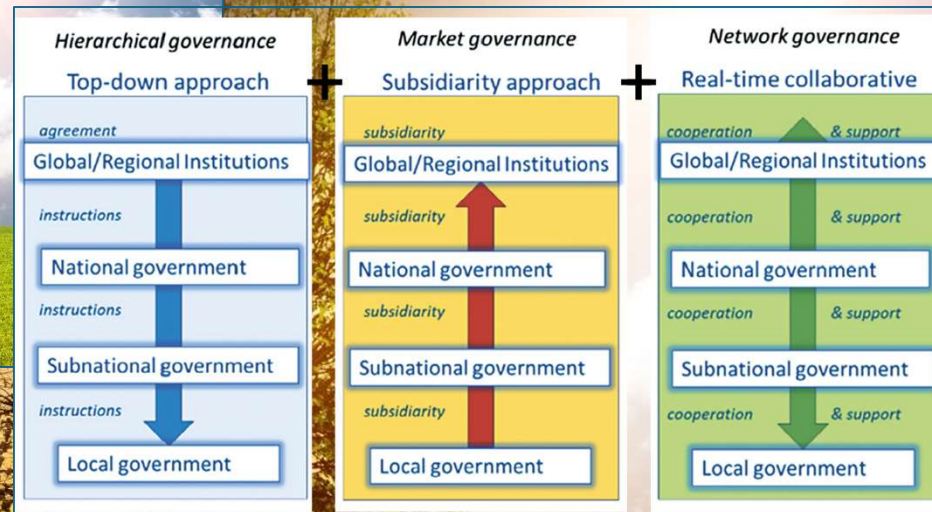
