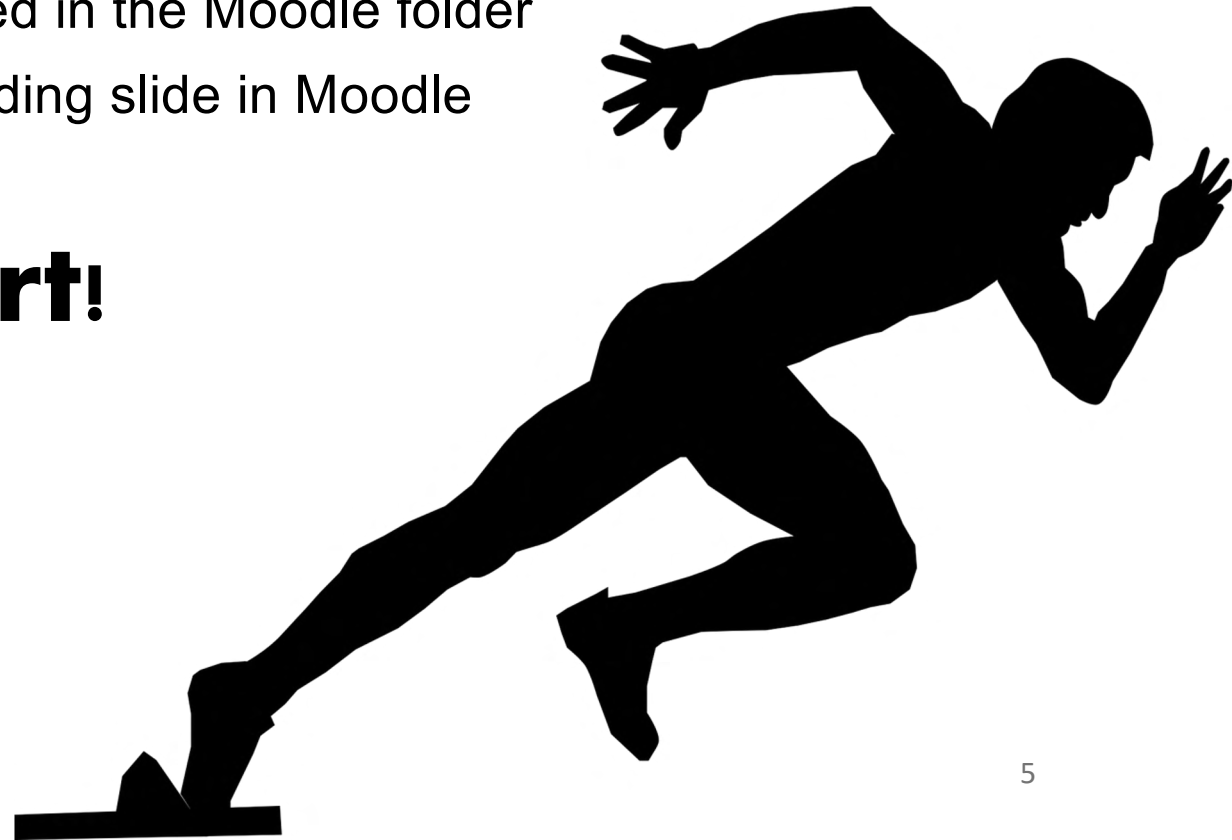

Development Account (DA) Project



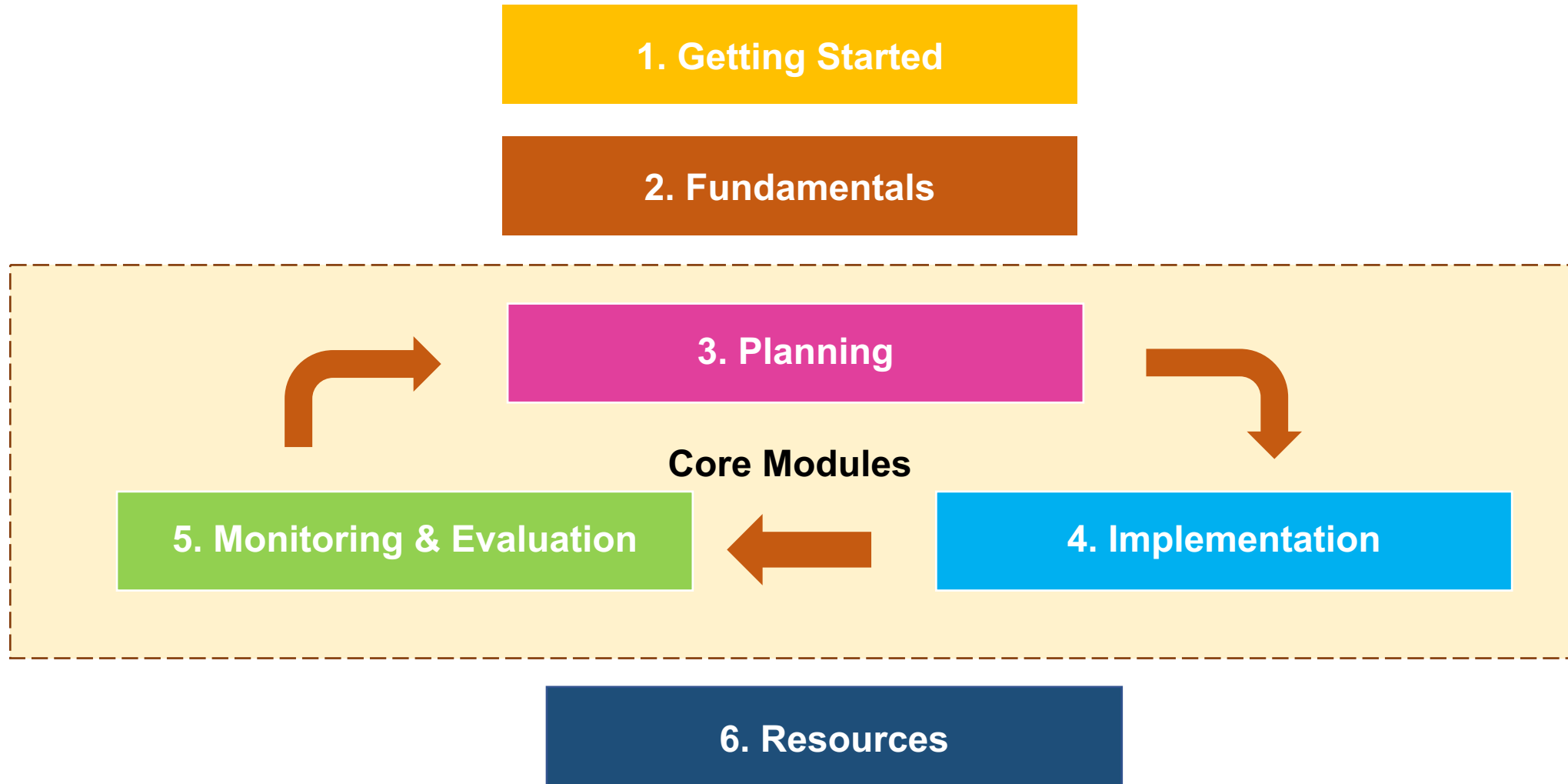
- Implemented by UN DESA-DPIG, in partnership with governments of Ethiopia and Bangladesh
- Aims to support the formulation of evidence-based e-government policies for advancing governmental service delivery and accountability in support of the SDGs
- Two primary goals:
 - Improve institutional capacity in target countries to collect, analyze and publish e-government and related sectoral data
 - Strengthen institutional capacity in target countries to implement evidence-based government policies and strategies, in support of select SDGs

DiGIT4SD Toolkit

- Part of the implementation of DA project
- Designed to help countries, especially LDCs, SIDS and LLDCs develop and implement digital government initiatives in supporting implementation of the SDGs and targets
- Offers best practices on digital government initiatives globally
 - Includes case studies
 - Builds on findings and recommendations proposed in past editions of the UN E-Government Survey
- This toolkit is useful for governments of developed as well as developing nations, academic institutions as well as civil society organizations
